

Funding and Service Agreement¹

Dementia Supplement for Elderly with Disabilities

(as attachment to the FSAs of Residential Rehabilitation Units
for Persons with Disabilities)

This is a document applicable to all residential rehabilitation units serving persons with disabilities except Long Stay Care Home with the allocation of Dementia Supplement (DS) and should be applied together with the Funding and Service Agreements (FSA)s for respective residential rehabilitation units.

I Service Definition

Introduction

Dementia Supplement (DS) is an additional resource provided for subvented residential rehabilitation units to strengthen their manpower to provide better care and training to demented elderly cases who have been medically assessed to be suffering from Dementia. Residential rehabilitation units except Long Stay Care Homes are eligible for the application of such resources.

Nature of service

In addition to the services provided by residential rehabilitation units, Dementia Supplement is meant for providing additional care and training for the target group of residents, e.g. memory training, training on activities of daily living and communication skills, personal and nursing care, etc.

Target group

The target group is existing elderly persons in subvented residential rehabilitation units. They should have been medically assessed by Psychogeriatric Teams (PGTs) or Community Psychiatric Teams (CPTs) of the Hospital Authority as suffering from Dementia to the level that warrants the provision of supplement.

Eligibility criteria

Eligibility criteria for Dementia Supplement :

- existing elderly residents of subvented residential rehabilitation units who are :
 - not receiving infirmary care supplement

- not residing in infirmary units of care-and-attention homes for the aged blind
- have been assessed/verified by PGTs or CPTs as suffering from Dementia and eligible for Dementia Supplement

II Performance standards

The service operator will meet the following performance standards.

Outputs

Outputs are included in the requirements of the FSA for the particular type of residential rehabilitation service.

Essential service requirements

- All services to comply with the administrative guidelines such as the Manual of Procedures of the Central Referral System for Rehabilitation Services (CRSRehab) and the Guidance Notes on Managing Allocation of Dementia Supplement.
- Staffing requirement includes occupational therapist, registered social worker and nurse.

Quality

Service operators will meet the requirements of the 16 Service Quality Standards (SQSs).

III Obligations of SWD to Service Operators

They are the same as the requirement of the FSAs for respective residential rehabilitation units.

IV The basis of subvention

It is the same as that of the FSAs for respective residential rehabilitation units.
